He professed his faith in Christ, at an early age, at Canaan Missionary Baptist Church. Later in life, he rededicated his life to Christ and became a member at Zion Hill Missionary Baptist Church. Herman was united in holy matrimony, on September 3, 1971, with the love of his life, Mrs. Annie Virginia Cunningham, affectionately known as "Jean". He dearly loved his family and friends and bestowed many acts of kindness upon them.
