He would gladly begin singing a classic gospel hymn "Father I Stretch My Hand To Thee."

After a mild heart attack his health began to decline. The Lord called him to rest on Sunday, October 8, 2017. He passed away peacefully at Symphony of Glendale Rehabilitation Center in Glendale, Wisconsin.
