Jason was a graduate of Compton High School where he played baseball and had several news articles written about his high school baseball career. Jason got a two year degree from Compton Junior College and received his Bachelor's Degree at Morehouse College in Atlanta, Georgia where he majored in psychology.

In his last year at Morehouse, Jason and Sheila Miller were married. Two children were born to their union, Kim Antoinette and Frances Marian. After nearly 30 years of marriage, he went on to start a new life with his now lovely wife, Evelyn Ray Cowan and her three children, Andre Nealy, Turquoise Ray and Nathan Armon, Sr.

Jason loved life, he loved to play jokes on his family and loved to travel. Jason and his college friends Noel Robinson, Jheryl Brisby (a deceased

administrator of Motown Records) and Gary Holmes started a group called the "Mindbenders." They had huge dances and events and when Jason moved his family to Indianapolis, the group started the "Party Line" where social clubs would pay to advertise their social events.
