“My Uncle Plural was a wonderful Uncle who always had a big smile and ‘big’ heart. I remember as a little girl he always asked me about school and my grades. Whenever I received an ‘A’ or a ‘B’ grade, he’d reach into his pocket and pull out a half dollar coin, place it in my hand and tell me, “Now, put that in your bank.” I recall always knowing when he was around, you could hear his voice booming throughout the house, his tall straight stature, and aquiline features and ready smile filling the room. Our home was his home, and most summer days when he came around he rarely rang the doorbell. He’d come through the door calling out, “Hello, hello, hello’. It wasn’t unusual for him to have a special treat with his visits — a whole yellow-meat watermelon in his hand — it was my Mum’s (and my) favourite. He’d could be very kind and generous that way.

After moving to the U.K. every time I visited Milwaukee he’d always say, “Send me a plane ticket to England,” and when I’d answer, “When do you want to come?”, he’d laugh and say, “Girl, I’m too old to travel those long distances.” His smile could be contagious, but he could also be serious when giving advice or sharing his ‘life experiences’.

There was a sense of acceptance from him that never changed! In that way, he was a wonderful Uncle to me, a brilliant Grand Uncle to my children telling them about his life in Texas, and he was fast becoming a remarkable Great Grand Uncle to my grandchildren. In fact, after just two meetings, he inspired my grandson to begin learning to play the harmonica. You see, there was music inside him always waiting to come out — in worship, at church picnics, or family outings — he and his faithful harmonica were ready to zip!
