Rhea Mona Davis was born December 12, 1944, in Forrest City, Arkansas to Jimmy N. Davis Sr. and Marie Young Davis. Mona departed this earthly existence on Wednesday, July 12, 2017, at her "appointed time", in her Milwaukee residence. Her parents, sister, Roe J. Austin and niece, Artency L. Davis preceded her in death. Mona grew up in Little Rock, Arkansas and received her formal education within the Little Rock school system. She attended Booker T. Washington Elementary, Dunbar Jr. High and graduated from Hoarce Mann High School. She regularly attended church with her family at Mt. Zion Missionary Baptist Church, from early childhood through high school. She was baptized at Mt. Zion Baptist Church by the late Reverend Dr. Fred T. Guy.
