Romero Romond Buggs was born on August 16, 1946 to Thula & Arthur Buggs in Milwaukee, WI. He received his education in the Milwaukee School system and achieved his Associated Degree at the University of Wisconsin, Extension in The Department of Business Management. Romero Buggs was the only black master knife grinder in the state of Wisconsin.

He was employed at Cozzini Bros Inc. for 43 years. Romero was a member of Pilgrim Rest. Missionary Baptist Church under the Leadership of Reverend Riser and later Pastor Childs. Romero gave his life to Christ becoming Baptist on December 31, 1992: He served on the Usher's and Nurses Board. He also was the chairperson for the church picnics, along with cooking every Saturday for The .MEN Lion Den. After retiring, Romero and his wife moved to Byhalia, Mississippi, where he enjoyed fishing with his best friend Princess, camping and hunting.

God called him home on February 14th, 2019. He was surrounded by his wife, son, and his family. He was proceeded in death by his Parents; Arthur and Thula Buggs, Brothers; James Boone and Garfield Boone, and Sister; Gladys Hampton.
