She embodied a large capacity to love, honorable servitude, humility, compassion, kindness,a clever wit, and the goal to draw individuals to her Lord and Savior Jesus Christ through many platforms. She will be dearly missed by so many and leaves all of us with comforting memories.

Mother Ruby was born November 24, 1943 to James and Frankie Richardson in Sunflower Mississippi,

She accepted Christ in her late teens. As she grew into womanhood, she became a Registered Nurse for over 45 years and eventually she specialized in mental health, drugs & alcohol which provided a great platform to, Let Her Light Shine. She served in the Wisconsin National Guard and U.S. Reserves Army Nurse Corp as a 1 st Lieutenant from 1980-1994.

She also was one of the 7 founding members of the Milwaukee Chapter Black Nurses Association. She attended UWM and graduated from MATC.

Mother Ruby was a dedicated servant of the Lord for over 60 years .. She was ordained and licensed

minister for over 45 years, and faithfully served at New Jerusalem Church, El Shaddai COGIC,Refuge

Fellowship Ministries, New Hope International Ministries, and City of

Deliverance. Mother was a part of the TBN volunteer group known as Prayer Partners for over a decade. She was affiliated and worked in the AA Allen Ministry and completing courses at Miracle Valley Bible College. She also attended Milwaukee Urban Bible College, Milwaukee Institute of Theology and received many certifications connected to her longing to "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." Mother was a faithful member of the 6:30am prayer-line started by her friend Mary Thorton for 6 years. Also, she was a co-founder with her daughter Jeannette of a weekly family prayer-line that was started in 2008 and will continue on with the consisted members of Rosie Watkins, Nettie Richardson, Jeannette Richardson, Allen Richardson, and Darren Dancil and we are hopeful for others to return. She started a ministry called, "Mom's Wit" years ago that started with encouraging letters and transitioned to sending around a hundred texts weekly. Most recently in the face of battling serious health issues, she returned to Milwaukee in December 2021 and had the opportunity to have a beautiful reunion with family and friends. Also, she renewed her membership at Refuge Fellowship Ministries Church (RFMC) and received so much love, honor, prayers and appreciation from Sr. Pastor C.A Lewis, ministerial staff, and the entire congregation. She accepted the honor of being the Mother of the church at (RFMC). Mother also ran her last revival at RFMC and was blessed to co-facilitate the Saturday Morning Prayer on Facebook Live. She fulfilled this assignment almost to the very end of her journey. Oftentimes, she would pray while experiencing great discomfort and would be heard before she prayed, saying, "God Give Me The Strength." She often mentioned her gratitude for being surrounded by so much attention from her family, friends,

and church. Mother knew she was loved and appreciated.

As Proverbs 31 :28-31, "Her children rise up and call her blessed" leaving to continue adoring her; children; Roberta Richardson, Jeannette Richardson, Allen (Yolanda) Richardson, Latrina Richardson, and Darren (Octavia) Dancil.
