Terrell accepted Christ at an early age and was baptized at Community Baptist Church in 1985, under the leadership of Rev. Roy B. Nabors. Terrell began his formal education at Harambee Community School, and continued in Milwaukee Public Schools. He was always intrigued with knowledge; if he didn't know he would research until he found the answer. Terrell's auto mechanic gift began to take shape in the year 2000, as he was called upon by his cousin, Keyon, to assist in repairing his 1979 Plymouth Volare; the vehicle that Terrell loved, and would forever speak highly of. It was obvious to anyone around him that if something was fixable, Terrell could fix it. He would spend hours working on family vehicles and ultimately gained an 18-year reputation for his mechanical skills. Terrell loved to work with his hands. This, coupled with a love for knowledge, fueled his exploration of gadgets and tinkering. Home repair and carpentry served as his pastime. As Terrell's father, Walter would say, "He was always a thinker." Terrell was always thirsty for new ventures. Terrell loved the game of baseball. As a youth, he played as

a Beckum-Stapleton Little and Senior League 'Angel', and as a Big League 'Pirate'. This pastime continued as an adult, playing softball with many of Milwaukee's tavern league teams. Also an avid football player during his youth, Terrell participated in the Athletes for Youth league as a Silver Spring Spartan, and for Cudahy and Custer High Schools. Terrell lived a Frank Sinatra lifestyle ... he did things "his way". Although he was not necessarily the most social individual known to man, Terrell would, definitely, show up when called upon. Truly a no-nonsense realist, he may even 'show out' if necessary. A loving father, family member, friend, and confidant. . . Terrell was a loyalist. You could count on him.
